MAY BOARD MEETING NOTES

Dredging Committee

A contract was received from KSN Engineering to oversee Phase 1 of the harbor study.

PA/Sound System

The Social & Cruise committee submitted a proposal for the PA System. Concern was expressed that the Board had not given any direction and specifications for what may be needed. Bob Doscher and Harold Farley volunteered to provide some input from the Board.

Facility Electrical Evaluation

Received a proposal for Electrical Survey & Design/Planning Services from Carr Electric.

ADA Compliance Project

Our Facility Manager had signed a previous contract from Claussen Engineering. This contract was for work not approved by the Board or Harbor and Facilities. The Club has been invoiced for charges that may not apply to the ADA compliance project. The most recent contract submitted by Claussen Engineering is unclear on some specifications. Commodore Hachman will look into the matter.

2004 Youth LTS Program

Learn to Sail instructors and assistants were hired. Orientation will be on May 22, 2004 at 5:30PM.

For Sale Sign

It was noticed that on F dock there was a "For Sale" sign on one of the boats. It is stated in our Harbor Rule, #16 that No commercial activity allowed on docks, including posting of "For Sale" signs on boats. The Harbormaster will talk to the owner of the boat.

General Meeting Suggestions

The Board reviewed the above suggestions. Concern was expressed as to the time required to process credit card numbers. Since the office has a lot on their hands right now it was decided that now is not the proper time to start this, but it may become a reality at a later date.

FBLI is researching obtaining our insurance with U.S. Sailing. They are hoping that they can come up with an all-encompassing group of policies to serve the club better.

The committee has some concerns on the handicap lift. The main concern was the improper use, i.e. freight. The key will be removed from the lift. ABC Regulations

Dear fellow club members,

Sometimes We forget that that the club is regulated by policies and laws set down by entities other than the Stockton Sailing Club Board of Directors.

By this I'm referring to State and Federal law: particularly those regulating the consumption of alcoholic beverages on club property. (ABC)

Please remember:

1. No one under 21 years of age may drink alcohol on club property.
2. Only club members and SSC. employees may be behind the bar.
3. All alcohol purchased at the club bar, must be consumed within the boundaries of our ABC liquor license. (Boundaries posted in club house) We do not have an off sale liquor license. Liquor may be brought into the club ABC boundaries, but once brought in is assumed purchased and must be consumed or disposed of, prior to leaving ABC boundaries.
4. All guests must sign in and wear a name tag.
5. Guest may purchase drinks at the bar, but they must be bona fide guests and be wearing a name tag.
6. Junior members are not allowed behind the bar for any reason. (including those over 21) Anyone under 21 may not be seated at the bar.

Pepper-Crusted Maple-Glazed Salmon

From Farley's Galley

Another great recipe for the boat, and so easy!

3/4 cup pure maple syrup
1/4 cup soy sauce
4 (6 ounce) salmon fillets
1/4 cup coarsely ground black pepper

In a large zip-lock bag, mix maple syrup and soy sauce. Add the salmon and marinate in the Refrigerator for 24 to 48 hours.

Place pepper on a small plate. Remove salmon from marinade and pat topside only into pepper to coat.

On the BBQ grill salmon skin side down, over medium to low coals, until salmon turns a pale pink. Do not turn.

I have tried this recipe on both my gas BBQ and my charcoal BBQ. I have found that the charcoal BBQ is by far the best because it gives the salmon a smoked flavor.

Adventures in Paradise – The value of Education.

I want to apologize to the challenged ones. Their behavior was exemplary during much of the Stockton Sailing Club Spring Series. That aside, it was still fun and entertaining to watch their starting ballet sequence.

It has been an interesting few weeks at Stockton Sailing Club. Club members seemed to be intent on educating some of the future sailors on various theorems of physics. One of the newer veteran sailors utilized his sailing vessel in an experiment. There were several parts to the research. The first portion consisted trying to determine if fiberglass tools, because they are really strong and useful, could be used to turn large rocks into small rocks. The second segment of the experiment consisted of demonstrating the interaction of the water displacement of a fiberglass object versus the weight of the same fiberglass object. The conclusion was fiberglass some vessels can displace less water than their overall weight. The final element of the demonstration showed the interface between the law of gravity, water displacement and weight.

Another club member, also utilizing his fine sailing vessel and those of other members, seemed determined on demonstrating the affinity between fiberglass and stainless steel. He repeated the quest several different times. He utilized various vectors, angles and speeds in his never ending search for answers. The final conclusion was that even though stainless steel and fiberglass by themselves are not magnetic, together they form a strange and unusual magnetic alliance with each other.

I want to thank everyone’s dock mate for providing me with the information about the trials and tribulations of their neighbor. That way it was the neighbor’s story that got told and not theirs.
