UNAPPROVED BOARD MINUTES
AUGUST 8, 2006**

Commodore Humphreys called the meeting to order.

Board Members present: William Humphreys, Mike Stefani, Peggy Feakes, Tom Lueck, Abe Ayala, Chris Corbin, Mike Bennett, Sam Dameron, Nancy Farnum and Rick Gibson.

Board Members absent: Bobby Doscher

Also in attendance: Susan McLain

Agenda: Motion to approve agenda for August meeting. Farnum/Feakes (M.S.P.)

Minutes: Motion to approve minutes for July meeting. Farnum/Ayala (M.S. P.)

Motion to approve minutes for June meeting. Bennett/Farnum (M.S.P.)

Financial Statement: Susan McLain presented a written report of financial activity for the month of July. It was noted there is a discrepancy for a member in the amount owed. Also the income attributed to the food category was erroneous. Susan will review and correct the errors and the Board will re-review the July financial report in September.

Correspondence:

1. Letter received from the Eberhards and Cammacks requesting that the time for their going-away party be changed to 1:00 p.m. to 10:00 pm on August 19th. Also the Cammacks request to move their boat to an end tie with Valkyrie on the day of their party. Motion to approve the request: Lueck/Corbin (M.S.P.)
4. Letter of resignation received from Art and Miyuki Bray. Motion to accept: Lueck/Farnum (M.S.P.)
5. Letter of resignation from John Heckle. Motion to accept: Lueck/Ayala (M.S.P.)
6. Letter of resignation from Edward Caul. Motion to accept: Lueck/Ayala (M.S.P.)

2. Letter of resignation from Larry Moon. Motion to accept: Lueck/Farnum (M.S.P.)
3. Letter from Recreational Boater's Association of California pertaining to a bill in the legislature regarding commercial boats and a fuel tax paid by recreational boaters. The letter will be posted in the clubhouse.

Old Business: Mr. Stefani reported that the nominating committee has a list of candidates for next year's Board. Two candidates are nominated for each office except the Treasurer. The list is attached to the minutes and incorporated herein.

Motion to approve these people nominated subject to additional nominations received in compliance with the Club Bylaws. Bennett/Farnum (M.S.P.)

New Business: Ms Farnum expressed the desire to solicit new members from people who are starting adult learn to sail lessons. She asked about the ability of the Club to give a discount to students who want to join the Club.

Susan McLain reported that adult learn to sail classes are planned for August and September.

Mr. Humphreys noted that the membership drive (50% discount on initiation fees) was set to expire at the end of August. He also noted that recently most of our new members have come from either Adult Learn to Sail or parents of children who have taken the Learn to Sail classes.

The Board discussed the pros and cons of the membership drive and alternatives to attract new members, but it was noted that the 50% initiation discount does work. Motion to extend the membership drive from August 31 to September 30: Lueck/Ayala (M.S.P.)

Mr. Stefani noted low water pressure on the docks. It was discussed that this is an on-going complaint. Some times of the day are better than others.

Primarily, this was thought to be a problem with the City of Stockton service.

Susan McLean has noted the problem and has a call into the City to see if anything can be done about it.

Facilities Manager's Report: Susan McLain submitted a written report which she discussed with the Board. There are 29 slip vacancies in the harbor. The quarterly inspection of the crane was performed but she has questions concerning the company's written report.

There was a small fire on H dock and a lit cigarette is the suspected cause. It was noted this is a serious problem and all members must be cautious.

There is also a concern that people (perhaps non-members) have been coming onto Club property and fishing from the docks. Security personnel has been asked to watch for such activity and enforce rules which prohibit it.

The left elevator has been repaired. Members have voluntarily replaced flowers in hanging baskets that did not survive the heat wave.

DBW has sprayed water hyacinth weeds in the harbor. Boat owners are asked to remove weeds in and around their boats. Staff will dispose of weeds left on docks and fingers.

Carr Electric will pour 6 square foot pads at the top of each dock for new electrical panels. The existing landscape at these locations will need to be removed. Volunteers are requested to help with the work.

The narrow strip of lawn between the parking lot and harbor near A dock has been removed and will be filled with concrete.

Some of the software for the office computer system has been upgraded. Our Club Steward has resigned and Ms. Buttler is being trained to take over.

Committee Reports:

Harbor and Facilities: Mr. Lueck reported the electric up grade is going as expected. There are no cost over runs at this time, but there will be some.

These organizations are encouraging delta marina operators to adopt Best Management Practices for operating clean marinas in the Delta area. As part of the boater outreach and education program, the California Clean Boating Network has provided Boater Kits for our members. Pick up yours in the clubhouse. They are located under the sign up table. Please participate in the survey by completing the form found on top of the table. You may leave it for me to mail for you. At the end of the month I will be attending a session regarding the State's Aquatic Invasive Species Plan to determine how it will affect our marina.

The Club has extended the membership initiation fee reduction through the end of September, so please encourage your guests and friends to become members of the club. Some of you may have a neighbor on your dock that has been putting off becoming a member; please encourage them to do so now. The Adult Learn to Sail program has brought in a few members of the community that are newly interested in sailing. The Adult LTS program also offers sailing lessons to members that want to expand their sailing abilities. Jim Murch, Tom Lueck, Dave Eberhard and Nancy Farnum have been conducting classes monthly.

I want to give a big "thank you" to Dave and Rose Eberhard for all that they have contributed to the Club. They make hard work look easy, and I want to say that they really know how to celebrate the boating lifestyle! Dave and Carolyn Cammack are headed south for Mexico also this month, which means that we will lose Carolyn's talents running the club's logo wear shop. The Commodore would like to hear from anyone willing to take over that responsibility.

The Club will be providing the Retreat area facilities on Saturday morning, September 16 from 6:00 am until Noon for those volunteers that will participate in the Coastal Clean-Up day in our area. Member Linda Driver is gathering food and beverages from community businesses to serve all that participate in the effort. Please call Linda Driver if you would like to join in.
