August 12, 2008

Commodore Feakes called the meeting to order at 6:35 PM.

Board Members Present: Peggy Feakes, Tom Lueck, Peter Hine, John Moyer, Hank Colberg, Steve Canepa, Karri Johnson, Gail Dameron, Mike Stefani and Dave Van Dyke were present.

Board Members Absent: Bob Camarena

Others in Attendance: Suzi Wasielewski.

Standing Business:

Agenda: Motion to approve the Agenda except approval of May financials only and move June approval to September meeting. Lueck/Moyer M/S/P

Minutes: Motion to approve July minutes. Moyer/Canepa Peter Hine abstained because he missed the meeting.

Financial Statements: Motion to approve May financial statements presented by Peter Hine. Peter also presented a new format of reports including a management summary created by member Bob DeHaan. Colberg/Lueck M/S/P

Facilities Manager Report: Edgar Okafuji was absent from the meeting.

Club Manager Report: Suzi Wasielewski reported 42 members were opting to receive their DockTalk via email. The change regarding key card deposits, as discussed at the April 2008 meeting has been made and is reflected on August statements. The credit card issue is resolved and the club is now accepting credit cards. The pay phone has been removed and a new phone, to be available for emergency use, will be installed outside and downstairs near the elevator. She also reported that our dry storage is currently full. Suzi is also working on a new "Guest Packet" for visitors as well as an after hours check in procedure. She has also taken a 24 hour sampling of the honor bar using chips. There were only 8 sales charged but 28 bags were eaten. She also did a test on vodka. The results showed approximately 64 drinks were poured and only 45 were charged.
