



#### The Regatta Report By Andy Goodman, *Chairman Regatta*



The SSC had a great year of racing in 2024. The Spring Series saw a new format for the PHRF boats, a Serious Race division and a Serious Fun division. A re-energized Etchells fleet was able to get some one-design racing going again. Our "special" races and Wednesday Night Beer Can races kept the racing going throughout the summer. In September, the SSC hosted the Pacific Coast Championships for the Thistle fleet. Finishing out the year, the Fall Series gave boats a chance to enjoy the cooler weather and changing scenery of the Delta.

The Regatta Committee is always looking to improve the racing experience and to get more people involved. There will be some changes for the 2025 season. The extreme heat of the past several summers has been taking a toll on our participants (and partici-

pation) in the late-June to August races. The Jack and Jill Race has been moved to a Sunday in April. This race and the Double Handed Race #1 are on Sundays following a Saturday Spring Series Race so you can leave your boat set up and only need one crew for the following day. Start times for the races in the June-July heat will be shifted later in the day when the wind is usually stronger and the peak of the heat has passed. Talking of evening racing, the Wednesday Beer Cans are always popular. A second race course will be added this year that will be shorter than the standard course. This will be a fun option for dinghies, smaller boats or those boats that want to go for a sail and then bbq a burger while watching the sunset.




