Motorcycle ride to the Nike Missile Station and Alice Restaurant

ur group went on another ride. This time it was a 2-day ride through the San Francisco Bay Area where we visited the former missile defense site Nike SF-88L. This site is located in the Marin Headlands, just north of the Golden Gate Bridge. We also enjoyed lunch at the Alice Restaurant, located along Skyline Boulevard.

We met as planned in front of the club house on May 24th at 9am and left shortly thereafter. We escaped the heat of Stockton, realizing that the weekend was going to be a windy one. While Marc carried Grace and their entire luggage for the weekend on their BMW F800ST, others from our group had their luggage brought by car.



We started the ride with 4 bikes, but in a usual manner, arrived at the hotel that night with just 2 bikes. This time, we didn't have any breakdowns. resulting in fewer bikes arriving. Only two of us, Dave, along with MaryAnn (who arrived by car) and Marc, accompanied by Grace, stayed overnight. The other two members of our group, Rob and Claude, decided to go home that evening.



Our group arrived at the Nike missile station just in time to join the last guided tour of the day. We learned that after WW2. there were 35 stations like this located along the entire West Coast of the United States, but hardly anybody knew about that. The missiles were stored in underground bunkers and were intended to be used as a defensive weapon in case of an air attack.

The entire Nike Missile Station program was decommissioned in 1974.



After the tour, we left the site and went south over the Golden Gate Bridge. heading toward the ocean. However, Marc's Garmin navigator had other plans (again), and decided to go straight to the hotel instead of the coast. We found the ocean even without the Garmin navigator and stayed at the beach for a short while. We then left and went to the hotel and had a good dinner.



On Sunday, we planned to ride the Skyline Blvd. and stop for lunch at the Alice Restaurant, located along the Skyline Blvd. However, we quickly realized that we were not the only ones riding this Memorial weekend who had plans to visit the Alice Restaurant. So, instead, we changed our lunch plans and started riding back towards Stockton once again. The wind was blowing very strong that weekend and with all this weight on the bikes, riding back was sometimes a bit of a challenge.



We stopped in Tracy for a late lunch and met the grumpy owner of a Chinese restaurant there in the town. We arrived on Sunday afternoon back at the club and promised each other not to go on our bikes for at least a week!



Stockton Sailing Club - NEW Volunteer Portal

The Stockton Sailing Club is trying a new volunteer management application called "Club Community Event Registration & Volunteer Information System" (CERVIS). We have dozens of events each year and they all need lots of volunteers to be successful. We hope that CERVIS will help our event organizers and regatta chairs recruit volunteers, Stay coordinated and keep them informed. We also hope it helps our members find new ways to get involved in the club.

You can find links to our portal at: https://www.stocktonsc.org/volunteer. The following options are found within the portal.

- Open Event Listings: This is a list of all upcoming opportunities to volunteer for regattas and on shore events.
- Sign In: If you already have an account, log in here.
- Create New Profile: If you don't have an account, create a new profile here. Eventually we would like all SSC members to create a complete profile, including your race committee experience, interests and talents.

Step by Step Instructions

- 1. Use your favorite web browser to open the portal: https://www.stocktonsc.org/volunteer
- Open the "Event Listing" (you do not even need to sign in yet!) 2.
- 3. Find your event and click it
- Pick "Click here to sign up"

Pick a time slot if prompted then click "submit" or "register"

- If prompted, log in with your account- If you do not have one it only takes seconds to create one (Only first/last names, email, and phone# are required to volunteer)
- 6. You will receive a confirmation email
- Were you prompted for a password and do not know it? Pick

"Don't Know Password I Reset Password" at the login prompt and you will receive a temporary one by email.

How To Video: If you still need help, there is a YouTube video showing you the step-by-step process to register for an event. CERVIS is designed to work with teams and groups, such as whole families that use the same email address. You may need to select your own name from the drop-down list when registering to volunteer.


There will be a reception for wine tastings and farmers' market samplings, followed by an unforgettable Farm to Table dinner.


