SSC like all the Sailing Clubs I have visited depends on volunteers for a large part of it's activities. Volunteers put out





Operating Instructions for the New SSC Chairlift



Summoning the Lift up or down

The three button panel at the top and bottom of the chair lift will summon the chair up from the bottom or down from the top so long as the chair is on; there are no key requirements beyond the key in the chair itself. These buttons will not work if the power button has been turned off or the key turned to the off position on the chair. These buttons will not work if the chair's swiveled out of position or the swivel handles have not been fully returned to their top position.

Power – 100% always on with Battery Back Up

There is no need to ever turn the chair lift power button off. The button is located on the left handle as you sit on the lift. This button is covered with a plastic cover in hopes that no one turns it off – ever. Being on will provide a green light on the same handle. This can be very hard to

determine in sunlight. The key under the same handle (left side) has been "rigged" into place with a zip tie. It

can but should not be turned. Turning it – turns off the chair lift. Battery Back Up is sufficient to allow the chair hours of use in the case of a power outage.

THREE SECOND RULE

This applies to all buttons on the chair lift. It applies to the buttons on the top and bottom of the stairs used to summon the lift. This rule applies to the toggle on the right handle used by the person in the chair to move up or down. This rule simply means the toggle or the button must be engaged, held down, and kept down for a least 3 seconds before the chair will begin to move. These buttons or the toggle need to continue to be held for the chair lift to move up or down. Once these buttons or toggle are released another 3 seconds will have to go by – before the chairs progress can resume.

Chair Swivel

There are two levers on the chair one on each side that enable the chair to swivel and the occupant to stand at the top of the deck or on the ground below. The chair must be swiveled back into place for any of the summon or the movement toggle is engaged, and we have just learned the handles on each side must be up completely for these to work. These handles tend to stop before they reach their reset point, and so the occupant needs to insure they are fully up to the highest point so that the summon buttons or the toggle work on the chair.

Staff members of the SSC have been trained to use the chair lift and help guests with it, and we are asking that members volunteer to learn these steps as well so that they can help others.
